Fishing competition offered to children

This summer, children have the opportunity to learn that "go fish" refers to more than just a card game.

The Bassmaster Casting Kids Competition is coming to Mississauga's Lake Aquitaine on July 8, starting at 9 a.m. The event is open to girls and boys (in age 7-10 and 11-14 groups) and is hosted by the Mississauga Bassmasters.

Admission is free.

The challenge is to flip, pitch and cast a hookless lure to a bullseye target. These are important skills needed to

catch fish.

Scoring is based on a points system, so the young angler with the most points wins.

Instructors will be on site to help children and all gear will be provided.

Winners qualify for the regional competition and ultimately the North American and World championships.

The Transport Canada Marine division and Ministry of Natural Resources will also be present at the competition.

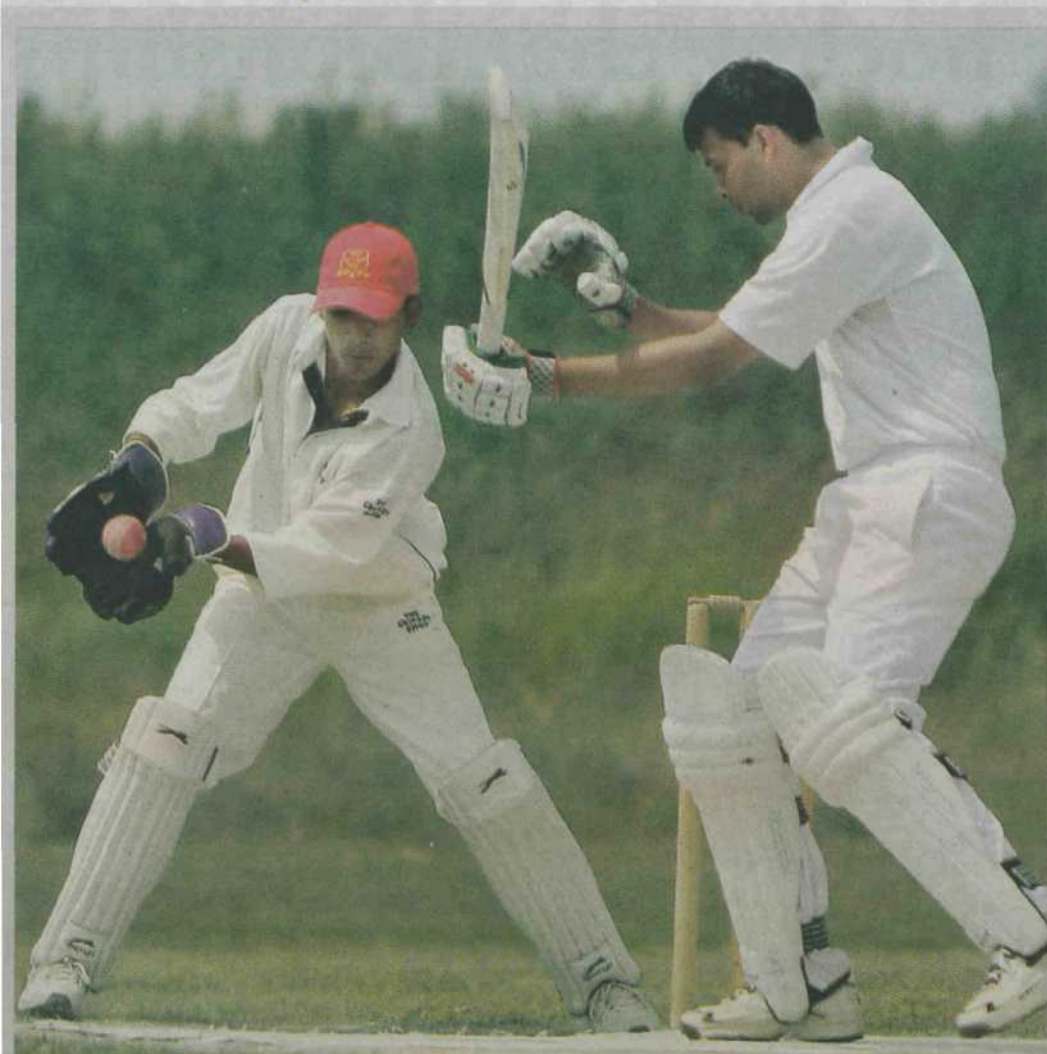
Entering Friday's game against the defending champion Czech Republic, Canada demonstrated some powerful offence in shutting out Germany 9-0
